THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

I. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

II. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; And showing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

III. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.

IV. Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.

V. Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.


VI. Thou shalt not kill.

VII. Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VIII. Thou shalt not steal.

IX. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

X. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbour's.



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IN THIS QUARTERLY

As we study the Word of God, we read about various leaders. They could be Kings, Pharaohs, Judges or Prophets. God's people, Israel, did not always have a king. For almost three millennia, the Lord spoke with the Patriarchs and/or Prophets. It was not until 1095 BC that Samuel anointed Saul to be the first king of Israel. Their choice of having a king like other nations put just a little more distance between themselves and God. James 4:8 reads: "Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you..."

Lesson For Sabbath, January 3, 2015

EARLY KINGS

Scripture Reading: Genesis 10:1-12. Golden Text: Proverbs 16:18.

NOTE: While we do not read the word king, we read about Nimrod's kingdom (vs. 10). Nimrod was Ham's grandson.

1. Where else do we read about Shinar? Genesis 14:1 (first part); Daniel 1:1-2.

2. What other kings are mentioned? Genesis 14:1 (second part) to 14:3.

3. After Abram defeats these kings, who else does he meet? Genesis 14:17-18.

4. How else is Melchisedec described? Hebrews 7:1-2 (King of Righteousness).

5. Who is Abimelech? Genesis 20:1-2.

6. Were kings part of the Abrahamic covenant? Genesis 17:1-6.

7. Was this reconfirmed when Sarai became Sarah? Genesis 17:15-16.

8. When God changed Jacob's name, what do we read? Genesis 35:10-11.

9. What kings also reigned before any king reigned over Israel? Genesis 36:1,3. Who else? Verses 40-43.

NOTE: Esau's descendants, just get farther and farther away from God.

10. Did Isaac dwell in Gerar like his father? Genesis 26:6-13.

Lesson For Sabbath, January 10, 2015

THE PHARAOHS

Scripture Reading: Genesis 41:1-16. Golden Text: Amos 3:7.

NOTE: While we do not call them kings, the Pharaoh's were treated like gods.

- 1. After Joseph interprets the dream, what does Pharaoh do? Genesis 41:38-40.
- 2. What else do we read? Genesis 41:41-44.
- 3. Did Abram have an encounter with a Pharaoh? Genesis 12:10-20.
- 4. Was it okay with God that Jacob journey to Egypt? Genesis 46:1-4.
- 5. Does this coincide with what the Lord told Abram? Genesis 15:7, 13-16.
- 6. What was Pharaoh's response to the Lords first demand through Moses? Exodus 5:1-2.
- 7. How will Pharaoh perceive Moses and Aaron after this first refusal? Exodus 6:28-30 to 7:1.
- *NOTE:* Verse 29 refers to Pharaoh as the king of Egypt, and in Exodus 7:1 he will see Moses as a god and Aaron as a prophet.
- 8. When the magicians could not bring forth lice, what did they say to Pharaoh, and what did he do? Exodus 8:16-19.
- 9. What changed when the Lord sent swarms of flies? Exodus 8:20-23.

10. Why was Pharaoh raised up at that time? Exodus 9:13-16.

Lesson For Sabbath, January 17, 2015

THE JUDGES

Scripture Reading: Judges 1:1-20. Golden Text: Zechariah 4:6.

1. What happened after Joshua died? Judges 2:8-10.

- 2. How did the next generation conduct themselves? Judges 2:11-13.

REHOBOAM

Benjamin stayed with Judah, and that is how we get the ten tribes. The ten tribes were in the North, Israel, and two were in the south, Judah, which included Benjamin.

Lesson For Sabbath, March 7, 2015

JEROBOAM

NOTE: The kingdom is now split and there will be two kings reigning at the same time, one in the north, Israel (ten tribes), and one in the south, Judah (two tribes).

1. What was one of the first things Jeroboam did when he became the king of Israel? I Kings 12:25-28.

2. Where did he set up these golden calves? I Kings 12:29-30.

3. What kind of priests served Israel at this time? I Kings 12:31-33.

4. How does this compare with the instructions given to Moses concerning the priesthood? Exodus 28:1-3; Leviticus 21:16-24.

5. What prophecy was given against Jeroboam's false altar? I Kings 13:1-3.

6. What other miracle occurred at that time? I Kings 13:4-6.

7. Does Jeroboam persist in doing evil? I Kings 13:33-34.

8. What happened when his son got sick? I Kings 14:1-3.

9. Even though Ahijah's eyesight was poor, what did the Lord do for him? I Kings 14:4-12.

NOTE: Remember there are two kingdoms at the same time, and it says that Abijam became the king over Judah, and it occurred during the 18th year of Jeroboam's reign in Israel (North).

3. Who followed him when he died? I Kings 15:8-9.

NOTE: Jeroboam was still the king of Israel (North).

4. How long did Asa reign, and how did he rule? I Kings 15:10-15.

5. Who succeeded Jeroboam in the north (Israel)? I Kings 14:20; 15:25-26.

6. What happened to Nadab? I Kings 15:27-30. See also I Kings 14:10.

7. Did Baasha enjoy piece with Asa king of Judah? I Kings 15:16-17.

8. What did Asa do with the king of Syria? I Kings 15:18-20.

9. How is Baasha's reign described? I Kings 15:32-34.

10. Was there a prophecy concerning Baasha? I Kings 16:1-7.

Lesson For Sabbath, March 21, 2015

3. Because he grew in power, what did the surrounding nations bring to this king of Judah? II Chronicles 17:10-12.

4. When Moab and Ammon came against Jehoshaphat to battle, what do we read? II Chronicles 20:1,3,5-6,15-17.

5. After he died, who reigned in his place? II Chronicles 21:1-3.

6. Did Jehoram follow the Lord? II Chronicles 21:4-6,11.

7. Who did the Lord stir up against him? II Chronicles 21:16-20.

8. When Jehoram died, who was made king? II Chronicles 22:1-2.

9. How was his reign? II Chronicles 22:3-4.

10. What happened to King Ahaziah? II Chronicles 22:8-9.
