

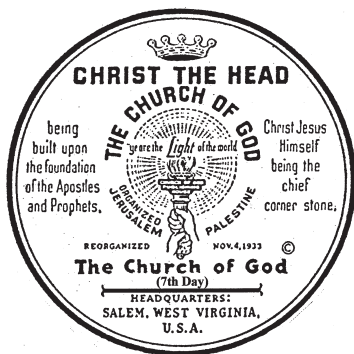


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As the new school year approaches, may we say a prayer for all the students and teachers -

Thoughts For Our School Children

The Lord brings these comforting words to us from Jeremiah 29:11-13: "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. Then shall ye call upon me, and ye shall go and pray unto me, and I will hearken unto you. And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart."

Though these words are for everybody, I especially want to direct them toward our school children, some of whom may be graduating soon. The Lord has promised to direct our steps when we trust in Him. Proverbs 16:9 reads: "A man's heart deviseth his way: but the LORD directeth his steps." So, even if you aren't sure what you want to do with your life, pray to the Lord to direct your steps and He will.

The Apostle Paul gave some good advice to his son-in-the-faith Timothy. I would like to share them at this time. In II Timothy 3:14-16 Paul wrote: "But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness". The Bible is all we need for daily living. Second Timothy 2:15 tells us to: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Don't be intimidated by older folks who look down upon you just because you are young. First Timothy 4:12-13 tells us: "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity...give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine." Bodily exercise is good, but godliness is even better. In I Timothy 4:8 we read: "For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable

unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." Make sure that you learn the Church's doctrines, or teachings. Chapter 4, verse 16 informs us: "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." Don't be fearful to live your Christian faith and to testify before others of your belief in God and His Son, Jesus. Second Timothy 1:7-8 reads: "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. Be not thou ashamed of the testimony of our Lord..but be thou partaker of the afflictions of the gospel according to the power of God."

Second Timothy 2:3-4 likens the Christian life to being a good soldier. Paul wrote: "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier."

In chapter 2, verses 22-26, Paul gives great words of wisdom: "Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart. But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strife. And the servant of the Lord must not strive but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient, in meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will."

Let me end this discussion with some of the final words of the Apostle Paul. He wrote in chapter 4, verses 7-8: "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing."

THE TOUCH OF THE MASTER'S HAND - by David Royer

The month of August reminds me of my sister Christina (Kina) Royer Casey Nelson (8/17/49-1/21/23). A decade before her death, Kina told me she enjoyed and related to a poem by [Myra Brooks Welch](#) written in 1921.

When I read it, I understood the connection and its universal appeal. The poem “The Touch of the Master’s Hand” is about a seemingly worthless old violin placed up for auction. There are no bids for the battered and scarred old violin until an old violin Master steps out of the audience and begins to play the instrument. The old violin came to life! With its beautiful sound and actual value demonstrated, the old violin attracts a high price because of the wonderful music produced by the Master.

The value wasn’t in the violin but in what the Master did with it. The poem ends by comparing this unkept instrument touched by the hand of a master musician to all people with typical negative human characteristics, touched by the hand of our Master, the Hand of God.

There are times when we all need help with ailments, sins, insecurities, depression, and self-loathing. We feel we don’t have much to offer, and we must seek the kind of help that can only come from a higher power. You see, there is the life-changing power of putting one’s trust and faith in the Master.

Our Lord God promises to those who ask and obey, a new heart and spirit. “A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh. And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.” (Ezekiel 36:26-27) This change and transformation from an old creaky useless piece of an instrument (humanity) to one that plays beautiful music becomes an inspiration and a blessing to many. God wants us to be like His Son, Jesus.

MOTHER MAY I - by David Royer

"Mother May I" was a children's game from long ago. There are various forms of the game, but this is how I remember the rules:

- Gather a group of three or more people, choose your "mother" (girl or boy), and have the mother stand about 15-30 feet away from everyone else.
- The children will take turns asking questions, beginning with "Mother May I" with the goal of reaching the mother first.
- If a child forgets to say "Mother May I" before their question, the child has to return to the starting line.
- The mother must reply, "Yes, you may" or "No, you may not, but you may take _____ instead." The mother should fill in the blank with another suggestion.
- The child must do what the mother says, but first, the child has to reply back: "Mother May I". If not, they have to return to the starting line.
- The mother can stick to the child's request or make another suggestion. For example, the child could ask to walk forward five giant steps, and the mother could reduce it to 2 baby steps. The mother could also ask the child to hop like a frog for those two steps.

As simple as this game is, I now realize valuable lessons learned:

- * If you play by the rules—you will eventually reach the finish line.
- * There may be setbacks to winning, but do not stop. Life goes on.
- * Develop good manners.

Reflecting on this past Mother's Day (a national holiday), Sunday, May 11, 2025, we can show our gratitude year round and praise by adapting this game. It is called: MOTHER, MAY I HAVE?

Mother, may I have a faith like yours?

Many mothers have been a light in this world, living by faith in the Lord. There is no better example than a mother

could give to her children than living by this faith.

Mother, may I have a heart like yours?

Mothers who love their children deeply ponder much in their hearts. (See Luke 2:19) They wonder what life their child will have and try to direct them with loving guidance, patience, compassion, empathy, consistency, and tenderness.

The selfless nature of a good mother is evident in her willingness to sacrifice personal desires for the well-being of her children.

Mother, may I have hands like yours?

My mother was very industrious. I remember working with her in our garden, grape arbors, and at the Church Publishing House. She worked as hard and longer than I did.

Mother, may I have time management skills like yours?

My mother balanced her parenting responsibilities with other obligations, such as work, taking care of Grandma, or her many household chores, without compromising the quality of our care.

Mother, may I have the love like yours?

Just as our mother loved us unconditionally, our Father in Heaven similarly loves us. He does not look at my life and think I am unworthy because I have not lived perfectly. God does not stop loving us because we make mistakes, which is VERY comforting.

In closing, remember, there is no such thing as a perfect mom. However, we are grateful and honor her always, according to God's Ten Commandments.

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2025 Young Adults Retreat guidelines are as follows:

- Young adult must be affiliated with The Church of God 7th Day, (Headquarters: Salem, West Virginia) church(es).
 - A friend recommended by a Young Adult can attend once the ministry has approved the young adult to attend.
- **Age Requirements:** 19-30 (exception with minister approval) years of age
 - single or married couples are allowed (sleeping arrangements are separate: Men on one side and the woman in the other.
- **Registration Fee \$ and Application:**
 - Registration Fee is **\$40.00** per camper which includes T-shirt, camp theme souvenirs, and meals/snacks/drinks for the duration of the camp.
 - Application must be completed and turned in by deadline: **(August 15, 2025)**
 - Application must include any food allergies, emergency contact, Camp T-shirt size, and other pertinent information pertaining to the camper.

A Peculiar People

When most people hear the word peculiar, they think of the meaning strange, odd, or unusual. However, the definition of the word peculiar found in verse 5 in this case means special.

In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses restated that the Children of Israel were considered a peculiar people in his last instructions to the Children of Israel. "For thou art an holy people unto the Lord thy God, and the Lord hath chosen thee to be a peculiar people unto himself, above all the nations that are upon the earth" (Deut. 14:2). "And the Lord hath avouched thee this day to be his peculiar people, as he hath promised thee, and that thou shouldest keep all his commandments;" Deut. 26:18

After the Children of Israel were freed from Egypt, God called Moses to him and gave him a message to give to the people. After this message God then gave the Ten Commandments to Moses to give to the people. The message God gave Moses is found in Exodus 19: 1-7.

"In the third month, when the children of Israel were gone forth out of the land of Egypt, the same day came they into the wilderness of Sinai. For they were departed from Rephidim, and were come to the desert of Sinai, and had pitched in the wilderness; and there Israel camped before the mount. And Moses went up unto God, and the Lord called unto him out of the mountain, saying, Thus shalt thou say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel; Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself. Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel. And Moses came and called for the elders of the people, and laid before their faces all these words which the Lord commanded him."

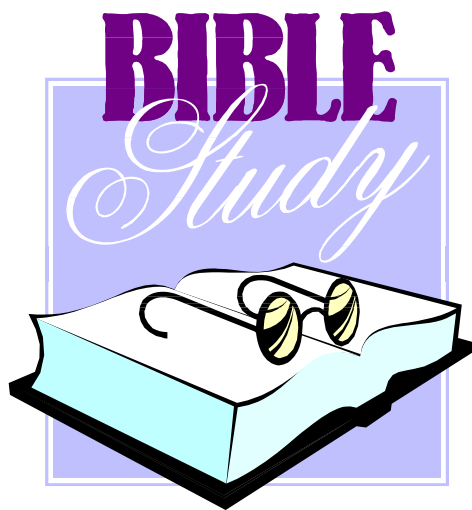
David also used this term in Psalm 135: 1-5 "Praise ye the Lord. Praise ye the name of the Lord; praise him, O ye servants of the Lord. Ye that stand in the house of the Lord, in the courts of the house of our God, Praise the Lord; for the Lord is good: sing praises unto his name; for it is pleasant. For the Lord hath chosen Jacob unto himself, and Israel for his peculiar treasure. For I know that the Lord is great, and that our Lord is above all gods."

The Apostle Paul tells us that after Christ's sacrifice, this term "peculiar people" is now used to describe all of God's Church, not just the Children of Israel. Titus 2: 11-15, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. These things speak, and exhort, and rebuke with all authority. Let no man despise thee." Peter also uses this phrase to describe God's Church in I Peter 2: 9-10 "But ye are a chosen

generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light; Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.”

Just as Israel was told to keep the Ten Commandments, we are told to do the same thing to be a part of God’s “special” people. We are also told to keep the testimony of Jesus. “Here is the patience of the saints: here are they that keep the commandments of God, and the faith of Jesus” (Revelation 14:12).

We should always remember that we are a special people to God. We are given this special place with God not by doing good works alone, but rather we are saved by the grace of God thru the sacrifice of his Son.



QUESTION: Why is a personal knowledge of the Scriptures of vital importance to every person, and without it why might some people be deceived?

ANSWER: "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world" (I John 4:1). "And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore, it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness: whose end shall be according to their works" (II Corinthians 11:14-15).

QUESTION: What is the best approach for searching the Scriptures?

ANSWER: "For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little; For with stammering lips and another tongue will he speak to this people. To whom he said, this is the rest wherewith ye may cause the weary to rest; and this is the refreshing: yet they would not hear. But the word of the Lord was unto them precept upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little; that they might go, and fall backward, and be broken, and snared, and taken" (Isaiah 28:10-13).

QUESTION: In what way does God warn His people to be on guard?

ANSWER: "Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace" (Ephesians 6:13-15).

QUESTION: We notice that when Satan was tempting Christ for forty days and nights (Luke 4:1-12), that Christ always answered him by quoting a text of scripture. What does the Holy Spirit instruct us to do when we are likewise tempted?

ANSWER: "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear" (I Peter 3:15).

"Prove all things; hold fast that which is good" (I Thessalonians 5:21).

QUESTION: Why did Paul declare the people of Berea to be more noble in God's sight than those living at Thessalonica?

ANSWER: "These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11).
