V. Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.

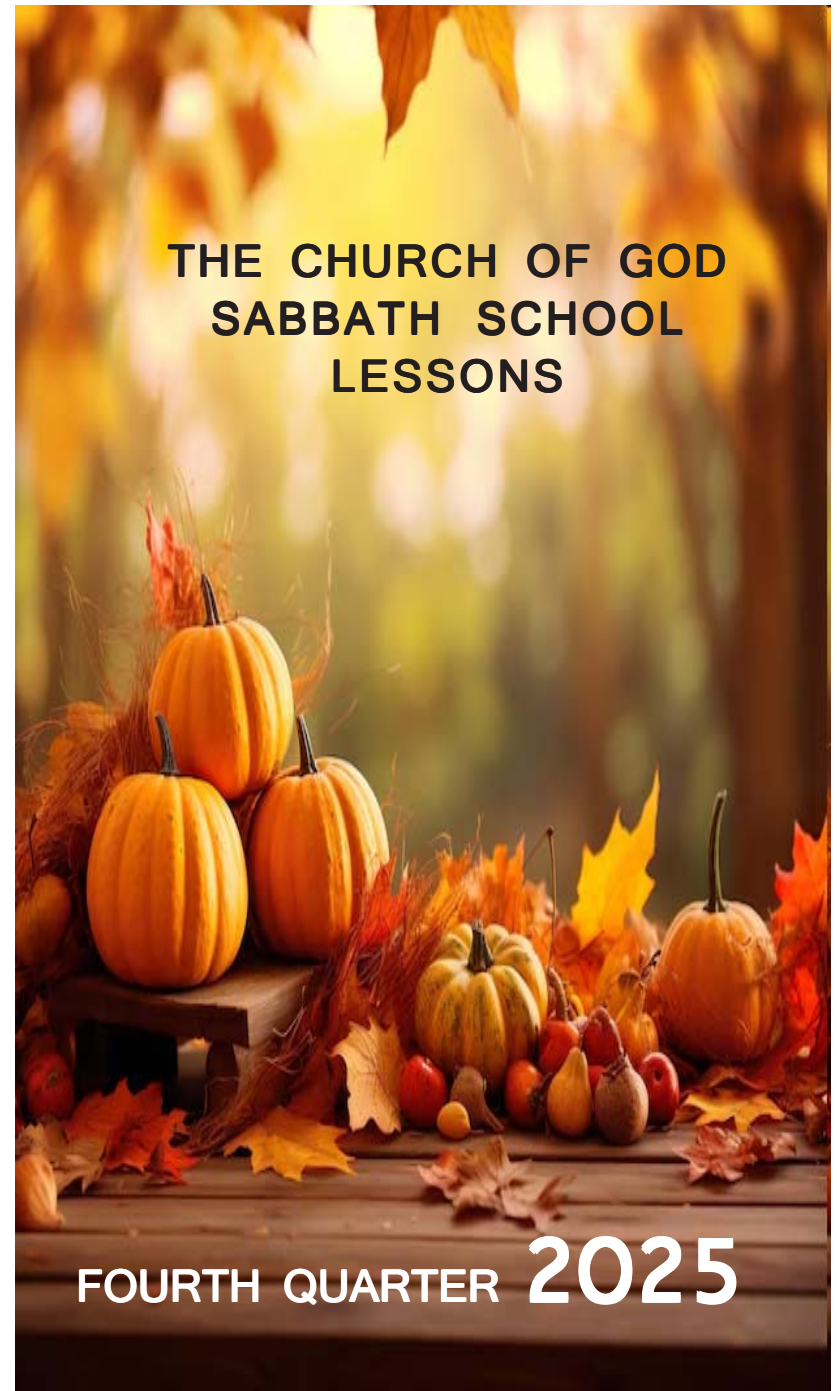
VI. Thou shalt not kill.

 - b) **Romans 9:7 last part***NOTE: Abraham is the faith of the faithful whether they be Jew or Gentile. Therefore, through the son of promise, Isaac, comes the seed which was not always faithful.*

5. Paul writes that we stand by faith, but of what are we warned? Romans 11:20 (second part) "and thou standfast..." to verse 22.
6. Can the process be reversed? Romans 11:23-25.

8. Where does Israel stand concerning the gospel? Romans 11:28, Revelation 14:1.

NOTE: We are to be good tax paying and law-abiding citizens.

6. Would we owe any man anything? Romans 13:8.

7. What does "thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself" briefly state? Romans 13:9-10.

8. Paul states a fact. Romans 13:11.

9. What does he suggest we wear? Romans 13:12.

10. How are we to walk? Romans 13:13.

11. Besides the whole armour of God found in Ephesians 6:13-17, what is Pauls' s final instruction of Romans 13:14?

7. What is happening now? I Peter 4:17, 18.

8. Paul states another fact in verses 11-12 of Romans 14.

See also Isaiah 45:23 and Philippians 2:9-11.

9. What is the kingdom of God? Romans 14:17-19.

NOTE: Don't argue about the issues but continue to teach.

10. What happened during Jesus' time? John 6:60-69.

NOTE: Like them, some will no longer walk with us.

Lesson for Sabbath, December 13, 2025

HELPING EVERYONE

Scripture Reading: Romans 15:1-16.

Golden Text: I Corinthians 10:11.

1. Should we help our neighbor? Romans 15:1-2.

NOTE: To help physically and spiritually is that excellent way.

2. Did Jesus please Himself? Romans 15:3; I Peter 2:23.

3. Why were things written aforetime? Romans 15:4, II Timothy 3:16-17.

4. What does Paul want for the Romans? Romans 15:5-6, I Corinthians 1:10, Philippians 1:27.

NOTE: To be like minded is a great step.

5. Paul encourages unity among the Jews and Gentiles. Romans 15:7-11.

Golden Text: Isaiah 52:15.

6. What do we learn about the brethren from Macedonia and Achaia? Romans 15:26.

7. They have learned not only the spiritual things but the carnal things as well. Romans 15:27.

NOTE: Carnal means things for the body of the Church. II Corinthians 9:6-7.

8. After he delivers the "fruit," where will he go? Romans 15:28-29.

9. Paul constantly asked for prayer. Romans 15:30.

10. Why at that particular time? Romans 15:31-33.

Lesson For Sabbath, December 27, 2025

THE EARLY CHURCH

Scripture Reading: Romans 16.

Golden Text: I Corinthians 12:12.

1. Who is a servant of the church at Cenchrea? Romans 16:1-2.

2. Paul names some helpers. Romans 16:3-4.

3. Have we read about Aquila and Priscilla before? Acts 18:1-3, 18, 24-26.

4. Where was their church? I Corinthians 16:19.

5. Who were "in Christ" before Paul? Romans 16:7.

6. The apostle goes on to mention many of the saints. Romans 16:8-15.

7. How were they to salute one another? Romans 16:16.

8. Of what does he caution them? Romans 16:17-18, I Corinthians 1:10; 3:3.

9. Their obedience will be rewarded. Romans 16:19-20.

10. Who wrote this epistle? Romans 16:22.

NOTE: Apparently the Apostle Paul dictated this epistle because he had trouble with his eyes. See Galatians 6:11.
